These can only be undertaken once, so it is essential to do your best work on them. Your final mark for the course is based 60% on tests and projects and 40% on the inquiry projects.

Each unit has a final test but there is also the option to do a project instead. You may choose to showcase your knowledge by taking a test, doing a project, or a combination of both. Each section has suggested topics for you to investigate called inquiries in the textbook. Or, you can negotiate your own topic with your teacher. Be sure to get permission first if you are investigating your own topic!
